JANUARY 30

INTRODUCTION TO THE ORDINARY WORLD

We are introduced to high school student **Cathy Vickers**. We learn:

- **Her mom** works as a nurse. She is oftentimes tired and they have a rough relationship, as the mom accuses her of doing drugs. Her father died before the start of the book.
- **Cathy** had a boyfriend, **Victor Chan**, who works at a biotech company and dumped **Cathy** today.
- **Cathy's** best friend is **Emma**, who is Chinese.
- **Cathy** and **Emma** speak about **Carla Beckman**, a woman from **Victor's** office who calls him. The two high school girls believe he is having an affair, which is why he broke up with **Cathy**.

PLOT POINT

Cathy has something that looks like a needle mark on her elbow.

FLASHBACK – NOVEMBER 11

MEETING VICTOR, REMEMBRANCE DAY

Cathy takes a bus to Golden Gate Park, where she is drawing. **Victor** approaches her and commends her on her artwork. We find out:



- **Victor** is in his early 20s. He's half-Chinese with green eyes; he knows a great deal about art.
- The two banter, cute and flirty.
- **Cathy** draws **Victor** at his behest. She does so as she imagines how he will look at the age of 60.

PAGE 8: Emma draws herself, complete with descriptions of her clothes and what she's trying to accomplish with the wardrobe. It's a cute character back story (graphic-novelish).



PLOT POINT

Cathy mentions Chagall's *Cemetery Gates* (left). **Victor** says he's never heard of it.



JANUARY 30
REMINISCING ABOUT VICTOR

Cathy is now acting as if she's over **Victor**, but instead she begins to discuss more about how they met.

- On their first date, **Victor** took **Cathy** flying in his uncle's plane. **Emma** came with them. (There is a comic panel on this page that details **Emma** getting sick in the plane)
- Later, **Victor** and **Cathy** went to dinner at Angkor Wat (This is a real place, but there is no significance to it in the book)
- **Victor** speaks French, but not Chinese
- **Victor** is an excellent card cheat



JANUARY 31
THE CALL TO ADVENTURE – JEALOUSY + VICTOR'S HOUSE

Cathy is hung over after drinking Gin & Tonics the night before. The next day, we learn:

- **Cathy** had a very bad temper about breakups; previously she had accidentally set **Brad's** car on fire after setting off firecrackers in at after a breakup
- **Brad** is the older brother of **Jenny**, a so-far unmentioned friend.
- **Victor** lives in Haight-Ashbury in San Francisco in a Victorian House.
- **Victor** is 23.

PLOT POINTS

- **Victor** supposedly watches the house for this Uncle, but he receives official Tax Notices addressed to **Victor**; **Emma** deduces that he owns the house and the plane
- **Cathy** believes **Victor** is somehow involved in the drug trade: either making them as the lab or smuggling them with his plane
- **Cathy** decides to go into **Victor's** house when he's not there



FEBRUARY 1
INSIDE VICTOR'S HOUSE

Inside the house, **Cathy** begins to describe elements that make up **Victor's** character. Among the things she finds:

- A bottle of French wine, Chateau Petrus, 1945 (This is not important to the plot, but you can find information on this wine. It's worth \$3,000 per bottle.)
- A Chagall painting
- Money from France, Spain, Morocco, Algeria, Vietnam and Cambodia

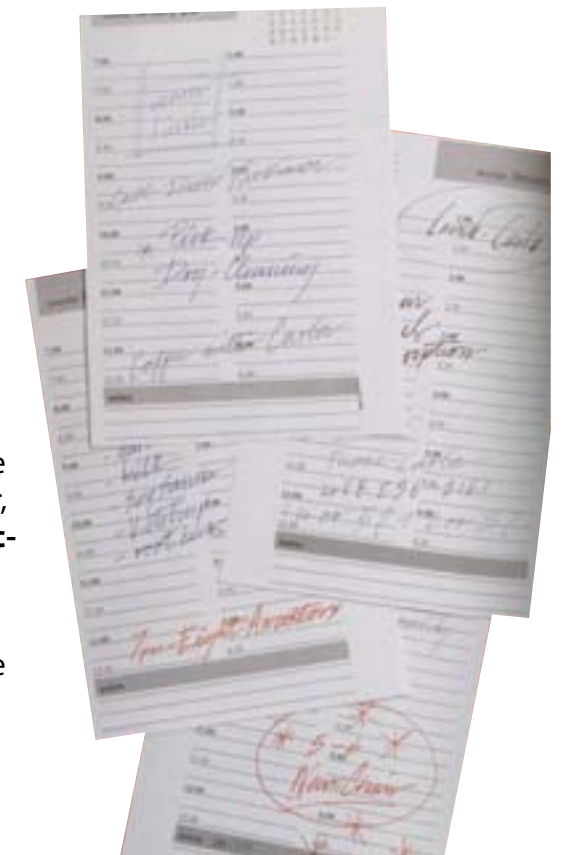
PLOT POINTS

- Hanging in **Victor's** house is Chagall's *Cemetery Gates*, which he said he had never heard of on their first meeting on Nov. 11; the Chagall painting is worth \$610,000.
- First reference to Eight Ancestors, an appointment on Feb. 1 at 7 p.m. (Graphics in the center of the book)
- First reference to a new chair arriving on Jan. 31 between 5 and 6 p.m.
- The **day planner graphics**, which have **Carla's** phone number, a voice mail code and other bits of information (Graphics in the center of the book)



• Inside the leather carrier on his desk, which are also graphically designed materials in the book: old letters, family tree, a wedding invitation written in French, old newspaper clippings, a picture of a mother (**Giselle**), a child (**Bianca**) and the father, taken in the 1940s in Kampong Son. The father is **Victor**.

• **Cathy** realizes she accidentally stumbled across a burglary, as someone ran out of the house when she originally arrived and knocked on the door.

FEBRUARY 1 REFUSAL OF THE CALL: EIGHT ANCESTORS

Cathy goes to the Eight Ancestors restaurant.

- She encounters a man outside who looks like a hitman.
- **An old man** talks to her after he crosses the room; he seems to be well known by everyone.

PLOT POINTS

- **Victor** knows **Cathy** took his day planner, but he also says he wants his jade back. However, **Cathy** didn't take the jade.
- **Victor** has a very bad temper, one that comes out when **Mickey Mouse** says something obnoxious about **Cathy** while they are in the Eight Ancestors. **Victor** catches the fire crackers thrown at **Cathy** and then beats up **MM** and his cohort.
- **Victor** seems to silently acknowledge that he did something to **Cathy's** arm. We don't know what.
- **Carla Beckman** is found dead near Monterey, where **Victor** took **Emma** and **Cathy** for lunch on their plane ride. (see Jan 30).
- **Victor** runs away.



FEBRUARY 2 MEETING THE MENTOR: THE MALL

Emma inadvertently becomes the mentor, pushing **Cathy** to begin the investigation.

- **Cathy** is shaken after the events from the night before.
- **Cathy's** dad was a painter. He loved her quite a bit.
- **Emma** has a plan to make \$30 million by the time she's 30, hence her obsession with straight As.

PLOT POINTS

- Intrepid Biotech was bought out by P'eng-Lai Pharmaceuticals at the same time **Victor** stopped talking to **Cathy**.
- **Victor's** wife **Giselle** and their child **Bianca** are from **Cambodia** (Kampong Som).
- **Cathy** took the wedding invitation, the newspaper clippings, the picture of **Victor** + **Giselle** from the house (Graphic section).
- In the day planner, **Carla's** phone number and four potential passcodes are there. (This is a direction into the puzzles. There are also GRADES next to clues in this chapter. This is an "A+").
- **Victor** begs **Emma** to not expose his "secret project" on her answering machine.

On page 45, we see the beginning of the investigation (or the Crossing the Threshold part of the story, which leads us into Act 2: The Investigation.)

FEBRUARY 3

FRIENDS, ENEMIES & TESTS (THE INVESTIGATION)

Cathy takes the BART downtown with a sketch she did of **Victor**, wearing a pendant. She encounters:

- a veteran
- a **Chinese Man** selling paper flowers
- a **Goth chick** panhandling (who **Cathy** speculates is on drugs)

Cathy wanders into two different places trying to find someone who might know about the pendant:

- Jade Empire
- Treasure Palane

Eventually she ends up in the My Jong Trading Co., where she runs into the **Chinese Man**, where they talk.

PLOT POINTS

- The **Chinese Man** offers to introduce **Cathy** to the **Emperor**, an unknown person at this point. To do this, **Cathy** needs to get the kuei tablet, an unknown object.
- An **Old Woman** gives **Cathy** a few Hell Bank Notes, money to pay the way for people who have died. (Cathy has no idea why.)
- **Cathy** recalls the day she came home to find her father dead in their house
- **Cathy** next meets the **Minister** (a relative of **Victor's**, she believes), named **Tsao**, who wants to find **Victor**.
- **Tsao** gave **Victor** the jade tablet, and has been looking for him for a long time.

FEBRUARY 4

THE INVESTIGATION: VICTOR'S DISEASE

Cathy and **Emma** exchange some emails, in which **Cathy** goes a bit too far and **Emma** lashes out at her. Meanwhile, **Minister Tsao** comes to **Cathy's** house at the end of the day.

PLOT POINTS

- **Victor** is **Tsao's** nephew.
- **Victor** has a disease that won't allow him to live a normal life span.
- **Tsao** gives **Cathy** a letter that **Victor** wrote about her.

FEBRUARY 5

THE INVESTIGATION: THE REST OF THE STORY

This chapter seems to be a compendium of all the facts of the case, with some speculation from **Cathy** about **Victor** finding a cure for ALS, the disease she believes he has.

She decided to break into **Victor's** airplane hanger and his office at Intrepid Biotech.

She snatches an identity + fakes an illness to get behind the security doors.

PLOT POINTS

- **Cathy** goes to **Victor's** airplane hanger, where she found a folder market LAFAYETTE ESCA-DRILLE.
- **Cathy** finds some loose-leaf copies of **Victor's** work behind his desk, before she flees the building.

FEBRUARY 6

THE INVESTIGATION: MOVING TO ANSWERS

This chapter begins to take us out of the investigation's question phase and into the answer portion of the story.

We're beginning to put all the plot pieces together. This chapter's narrative happens over Instant Messenger: **Cathy** is simultaneously talking with **Emma** (her friend) and **Victor** (who has been missing).

PLOT POINTS

- **Cathy** and **Emma** figure out that **Victor's** work (Telomere Repeats Amplification Protocol) is about cellular aging.
- **Victor** admits he got his money from investments in stocks, mines and banks.
- **Victor** mentions **George Wingfield** is his friend.
- **Victor** denies that **Tsao** is his Uncle or that he gave him the pendant; he does agree to meet him at 11 a.m. on Friday at the Musee Mecanique.

One interesting point to note: now that we're moving into the re-assembly portion of the story, there is a brief interlude chapter (**Feb. 5:** Really Awfully Late, pg. 89) that sums up the key points in the investigation so far in the form of a journal of **Cathy's** longing to speak with **Victor** by recounting everything she's found out.



FEBRUARY 6 (MORNING ENTRIES)

APPROACH TO THE INNERMOST CAVE: REFLECTIONS & MOTIVATIONS

These three diary entries move us from the Investigation into the reflective section of Act 2, just before the final confrontation takes place. Here, **Cathy** and her mother put their differences aside (and **Cathy** pours out her mother's alcohol). They reflect on **Cathy's** deceased father and bond over a morning breakfast (the "last meal"). **Emma**, freaked out about her family's pending bankruptcy, determines that love and friendship is more important than studying and plans. She whisks **Cathy** away, taking her to dinner before heading over to **Victor's** house, a stark change. This section begins the final push to The Ordeal.

PLOT POINTS

- **Cathy** scoops up piles of papers from **Victor's** desk
- **Cathy** and **Emma** set off an internal alarm and two cops show up. They appear to be working for **Tsao** and reveal a great deal of information about **Cathy**, while talking with each other. That fact freaks **Cathy** out, and makes her realize she's been followed this whole time.

FEBRUARY 8

THE ORDEAL: SPLIT CHAPTER

This is by far the longest section of the book, and it takes us from the end of Act 2 into the beginning of Act 3.

Cathy goes to spy on **Victor** and **Tsao**, who are meeting in San Francisco. There are two uniformed cops—the same two who have been trailing her, who are identified as "special police". She sneaks into the mannequin museum (Musee Mecanique).

The two cops apprehend **Cathy**. She realizes they are not arresting her but instead taking her to whomever hired them. They imply she will be killed.

She begins to have flashbacks about her mother, **Emma**, and her grandfather .

Fearing for her life, **Cathy** calls **Emma** and leaves her cell phone on the ground so that her friend can track her.

The cops drop **Cathy** off. **Jun** meets them at the gate, releases the cops from their service and takes **Cathy** to see **Ancestor Lu**. There are well-dressed **Chinese men** on cell phones throughout.

Cathy realizes that **Ancestor Lu** is the CEO of P'en Li Pharmaceuticals, which bought Intrepid, where **Victor** works. He's trying to control the research.

Ancestor Lu is alerted that **Victor** has been trailing **Cathy** and tells **Jun** that everything is proceeding as planned.

Jun crouches behind a door and as **Victor** comes in. **Jun** shoots him three times.

PLOT POINTS

- **Cathy** spies on **Victor** and **Tsao** in the Musee Mecanique, where she hears **Tsao** say that everyone involved with **Victor** has to die. She misinterprets this.
- **Cathy** nicknames the cops: **Bud** (the older one) and **Perry** (the younger one). They drive her outside of San Francisco past San Jose to a large complex outside the city.
- **Bud** and **Perry** drop **Cathy** off at a mansion, where **Jun** is waiting for them.
- **Jun** takes **Cathy** to see **Ancestor Lu**, the leader of the House of Lu Tung Pin. As they approach, they come across **Little Sister**, the only non-Chinese person in the mansion.
- Through dialogue, we find that the old man from the pawn shop is **Chang Kuo Lao**, apparently an enemy of **Ancestor Lu**.
- We find that **Ancestor Lu** is the old man **Cathy** encountered outside the Eight Ancestors restaurant

FEBRUARY 8 THE REWARD

Victor's wounds heal immediately and **Cathy** realizes that **Victor** isn't dying. He can't die.

Victor and **Jun** continue to fight sporadically as **Victor** and **Ancestor Lu** explain the entire story to **Cathy**. **Victor** has outlived his previous loves, always leaving them after a few years as they begin to age. This includes his children, who have never seen him either.

Ancestor Lu gives **Victor** an ultimatum: come work for him and **Cathy** lives, or don't and **Cathy** dies.

Little Sister arrives and **Jun**, who believes **Ancestor Lu** is obsessed with curing death to save the little girl, attempts to kill her but **Cathy** prevents it from happening.

Lu banishes **Jun**, and she leaves.

Lu tells **Victor** that if he attempts to leave, his men will kill **Cathy** and force him to stay.

However, **Emma** convinced the police to trace her call from **Cathy** and they arrived to arrest **Lu** and his entire compound. Except for **Jun**, who was already gone.

Victor is arrested as well, although the police say they just want his statement on what happened.

Cathy and **Victor** kiss. The murders -- and the plot to kill **Victor** -- is solved.

PLOT POINTS

- **Victor** was born in 1885, and it wasn't his Uncle in the pictures. It was him.
- **Giselle** was killed in a car wreck, which meant he got to spend nearly a decade with his daughter **Bianca** while she grew up.
- **Ancestor Lu** reveals he wants to stop death so that **Little Sister** won't die; **Jun** tries to kill **Little Sister** to end **Lu's** attempt to cure death. **Lu** banishes **Jun** from the compound.
- The police arrive, tipped off by **Cathy's** call to **Emma**. They arrest **Lu** and his entire compound; **Jun** has escaped.
- **Victor** explains that the prick on **Cathy's** arm was a blood test, one that revealed she wasn't immortal.
- **Cathy** and **Victor** kiss.

Feb. 9: Afternoon The Road Back, Resurrection, Return with the Elixir

FEBRUARY 9 THE ROAD BACK

Cathy is back home, celebrating her 18th birthday with her mother, **Emma**, and **Emma's** father.

The two families have fun with each other, exchanging stories about their lives when the doorbell rings. Thinking it's **Victor**, **Cathy** leaps through the doorway only to find that it's **Tsao**. He comes with bad news: **Ancestor Lu** has escaped.

Emma's father, **Mr. Cheung**, extolled a few ideas he and **Emma** were kicking around in order to get back on their feet.

Talk turns to the 8 Immortals, and **Mr. Cheung** begins to list them. The characters that have appeared throughout as the story emerges.

Tsao, after helping **Mr. Cheung** list the last Immortal (**Tsao** himself), says he may have some money to invest in the **Cheungs'** businesses.

PLOT POINTS

- **Cathy** has returned home to celebrate her birthday with her friend and family.
- **Ancestor Lu** has escaped; **Victor** is gone.
- The 8 Immortals (Ancestors) are:
 - **Chung Li Ch'uan** + **Ancestor Lu**
 - **Ho Hsien**, the housewife
 - **Lan Tsai Ho**, who looks after the flower sellers
 - **Han Siang Tzu**, the musician
 - **Iron Crutch Li**
 - **Chang Kuo Lao**, riding backwards on his donkey
 - **Tsao Kuo Chiu**

FEBRUARY 9

THE RESURRECTION

A **FedEx driver** arrives just as the party is breaking up. **Emma** and **Cathy** anxiously tear open the package. Inside is a letter from **Victor**, who writes that he loves **Cathy** but that he needs to track down **Lu**.

He has shed his desire to hide from love. He tells her he loves her and that he will never stop coming for her.

Emma's plans are also back on track now that **Tsao** has agreed to fund a business idea. She is very excited.

PLOT POINTS

- **Victor** is re-born, vowing to find **Cathy** after he finds **Ancestor Lu**.
- **Emma** and her father have an idea that **Tsao** decides to fund.
- **Tsao** tells **Cathy** she was born on the First Day of the Year of the Tiger.
- **Cathy** prints out her diaries at Emma's request, and tells her to have the investigators call all the numbers and look at all her sketches to find the truth.

RETURN WITH ELIXIR

Cathy's journey is just beginning. Armed with her knowledge, she can no longer stay in her world.

CATHY'S KEY

Six weeks after graduating, she left for St. Louis to meet with an immortal named **Auntie Joe**, who claimed to have knowledge about **Tsao**.

Auntie Joe gives her a website and phone number, which reveals that the woman **Tsao** loved was born on the First Day of the Year of the Tiger, like **Cathy**.

Cathy travels to St. Louis where she learns that **Tsao** is **Victor's** father and that **Tsao** will kill **Cathy** unless he can marry her.

She also tells **Cathy** that her father had been murdered. He hadn't died of a heart attack.

On the way home from St. Louis, she sits next to a young woman about her age, **Jewel**, who tries to befriend her.

PLOT POINTS

- **Tsao** apparently murdered the woman he loved and her boyfriend.
- The First Day of the Year of the Tiger is significant.
- **Tsao** is **Victor's** father.
- **Tsao** wants to marry **Cathy** or kill her if he can't.
- **Cathy's** father was murdered; he didn't die of a heart attack.
- **Jewel**, a young woman **Cathy** meets on the bus, tries to befriend her after trying to scam her out of money.

STEAMPUNK PRIMER

“Steampunk is a sub-genre of science fiction, alternate history, and speculative fiction that came into prominence during the 1980s and early 1990s. Specifically, steampunk involves an era or world where steam power is still widely used—usually the 19th century and often Victorian era Britain—that incorporates prominent elements of either science fiction or fantasy. Works of steampunk often feature anachronistic technology or futuristic innovations as Victorians may have envisioned them; in other words, based on a Victorian perspective on fashion, culture, architectural style, art, etc. This technology may include such fictional machines as those found in the works of H. G. Wells and Jules Verne or real technologies like the computer but developed earlier in an alternate history.

Other examples of steampunk contain alternate history-style presentations of “the path not taken” for such technology as dirigibles, analog computers, or such digital mechanical computers as Charles Babbage and Ada Lovelace’s Analytical engine.

Steampunk is often associated with cyberpunk. They have considerable influence on each other and share a similar fan base, but steampunk developed as a separate movement. Apart from time period and level of technology, the main difference is that steampunk settings tend to be less dystopian.

Various modern utilitarian objects have been modded by individual artisans into a pseudo-Victorian mechanical “steampunk” style, and a number of visual and musical artists have been described as steampunk.

Although many works now considered seminal to the genre were published in the 1960s and 1970s, the term steampunk originated in the late 1980s as a tongue in cheek variant of cyberpunk. It seems to have been coined by science fiction author K. W. Jeter, who was trying to find a general term for works by Tim Powers (The Anubis Gates, 1983); James Blaylock (Homunculus, 1986); and himself (Morlock Night, 1979, and Infernal Devices, 1987)—all of which took place in a 19th-century (usually Victorian) setting and imitated conventions of such actual Victorian speculative fiction as H. G. Wells’ The Time Machine.
